COURTESY VISIT TO THE NIGERIA HIGH COMMISSION



The Executive Committee of our District (ICAN UK and District Society) made a courtesy visit to The Nigeria High Commission (NHC) London on Wednesday 17th August 2016 at 1.00 PM. The meeting was attended by seven members of the executive committee and one past chair who happen to be at the High Commission for another meeting before our scheduled time and joined in for our visit. Ten officers of the High Commission were in attendance, including the Acting High Commissioner Mr. Adah Simon Ogah.

Mr. Funso Ajayi, Chair ICAN UK & District Society was invited to give his remark. He thanked and appreciated the AHC and his team for making out time to receive ICAN UK Executives and delegates. He mentioned the Annual September ICAN UK Seminar, which holds in NHC's Tafida hall and made an informal request to use the hall in September 2016. He extoled past and present collaborations between NHC and ICAN UK and called for closer ties going forward. He subsequently introduced ICAN UK Executive committee members and the past chair in attendance.

The Acting High Commissioner (AHC) welcomed ICAN UK delegates and gave a brief talk on the extensive functions of the High Commission and limitations as to what should be expected by Nigerians in the diaspora. He introduced NHC officers in attendance and emphasised that High Commissions have rather strict coverage areas (usually the country of location) and are unable to operate in any other location. He further elaborated that High Commissions monitor trade relations, economic developments, sporting developments, government policies and practices in the host country and recommends as appropriate to the home country on how to best protect her interests. He highlighted that issuance of travel documents is only a small part of the High Commission's functions.

The AHC replied to question from Austin Akhuemokhan on voting during elections by Nigerians in the diaspora, that this has been discussed severally and extensively, but no firm plan is being pursued at present; he further mentioned that the current Nigerian constitution does not allow voting from outside Nigeria, hence an amendment will be required for voting outside Nigeria to happen; a massive deployment of resources (voting centres etc.) would also be required.

The Vice Chair – Bim Osunsami gave the vote of thanks and thanked the AHC & NHC officers for their time and support.

Purpose: Develop code of conduct for members of the ICAN UK and District Society and ensure protocol at all meetings (including timeliness); deliver appropriate and relevant Bye-Law concessions to ensure continued harmony - ensure concessions granted to previous Caretaker Committee is extended for at least 3 years.

REGIONS COMMITTEE

Purpose: Reach out to and involve members located in other United Kingdom regions in District activities.

BENEVOLENT FUND

Purpose: This fund was set up by the pioneers of ICAN UK and District Society in 2014. It is to serve as a practical way of demonstrating the District's commitment to part of its mission to "... help our members achieve professional excellence and social well-being ..."


